April Session Recap

Prior to the Session meeting, Session members shared an enjoyable potluck meal with members of the **transgender support group** that meets at Trinity. Session will continue to meet with the group on a quarterly basis.

The Session meeting began outside in front of the sanctuary where Bill Raiford explained the need for a survey and architectural plans for correcting drainage and ADA issues in the front of the church. The motion was made and unanimously approved to release the money, approximately \$3500, for the assessments.

Session members reflected on the Session retreat that was held on April 13. All committees will be working on mission statements using guidelines discussed at the retreat.

The Treasurer reported that, due to an influx of pledged income, income for March exceeded budget by \$4,916. Expenses for the month exceeded budget by \$2,382.60.

The Personnel and Finance Committee brought a recommendation that the **Online Giving service facilitating donations through our website** be approved. Session approval is required since there is a fee associated with the service. The Session voted to approve the recommendation.

The Deacons reported that their efforts to increase participation from the congregation in providing refreshments during Fellowship Time have not been successful. The Session agreed that the Fellowship Time is of great value to the congregation, but also that shouldering that responsibility is becoming a burden to the Deacons. Session members shared ideas for encouraging either greater participation and/or simplifying the effort, including potentially discontinuing Fellowship Time.

Jon asked for and Session approved the following vacation dates: May 20-27; July 15-21; Aug. 4-10.

The Session discussed two chapters from the book *Community: The Structure of Belonging* by Peter Block. The chapters contrast traditional leadership (top down and involving finding a problem and fixing it) vs. leadership as convening (nurturing gifts, accountability and commitment, listening and paying attention).

The Capital Campaign reported that the interviews with the Consultant, Jeff Sockwell, are going well. Jeff will report his findings at the next Session meeting scheduled for June 2.

One final note from the Food Pantry: At present, we have enough egg cartons and are running out of storage space. Let's hold off on those donations for now.



From Ministries Beyond Welcome

The bill that would end "conversion therapy" in North Carolina is the Mental Health Protection Act, and it has seen huge support from both legislators and the public. The longstanding practice by licensed mental health providers attempting to change a young person's sexual orientation or gender identity is unethical, dangerous, and frankly, impossible. We are now in the final days before the deadline and legislators on the NC House Health Committee have yet to schedule a hearing for this important piece of legislation. 
