From the Pastor's Studio



In February 2022 we began meeting with the charge to create a new committee structure that would help Trinity live into our mission, reflect our current capacity, and facilitate greater communication, focus, and alignment of church activities. As part of this work, we facilitated open visioning/listening conversations on three dates, in-person and on Zoom, that engaged 41 people in identifying goals for our congregation for the next 1-2 years. The Session has identified these major themes as deep values held by Trinity:

- 1) Seeking Justice
- 2) Building Community (both within ourselves and with sister congregations, i.e. Dellabrook and El Buen Pastor)
- 3) Providing a space of oasis/rest/prayer to equip us for our ministries in the world
- 4) Continuing to be open, affirming, and intergenerational

The good news is that these values fit with our current mission statement like a glove, and therefore have a solid foundation and understanding of who we are and our identity.

To help implement what you've named as our values, we have a subcommittee currently in place to restructure our committees and we will be planning on having another lunch sometime in September to introduce their recommendation to you and solicit your feedback. Our committee structure has been long overdue for an overhaul, and as we try to find our footing as a small church with limited volunteers and energy, they have been working hard to make our committee work simple, practical, focused, and meaningful. (Shout out to Cindy B., Megan G., Brenda D., and George Edwards for their commitment to this subcommittee!)

On a related note, last month the Session approved becoming a Matthew 25 congregation (see page 3 or click [here](#) to learn more). Sometimes the General Assembly of the PC (USA) puts out these programs for churches to latch onto without much traction. Not so with this initiative! This initiative, led by our leaders of color, aims at equipping us and challenging us to live boldly into the gospel's calling for peace and justice locally. It provides us a much needed framework to lean on since we are all so busy and weary.

As you can see, things are picking up around here. (I'm actually busier this summer than I was during Christmas and Easter!) It's exciting to see our church's identity continue to take form, as well as stir us into the next chapter of mission and ministry together.

Community and World Service Update

Becoming a Matthew 25 church

At its last meeting, the Session voted for Trinity to become a Matthew 25 congregation. Matthew 25:31-46 calls all of us to actively engage in the world around us, so our faith comes alive and we wake up to new possibilities. Convicted by this passage, both the 222nd and 223rd General Assemblies (2016 and 2018) of the Presbyterian church challenged the PCUSA to serve people who are hungry, oppressed, imprisoned or poor.

There are already over a thousand Presbyterian congregations committed, identifying themselves as Matthew 25 churches. Trinity has a long history of doing social justice and caring for the disadvantaged

The three areas of concern for Trinity to embrace this program, are:

Building congregational vitality by challenging people to deepen their faith and get actively and joyfully engaged with their community and the world. A community's vitality is primarily its spiritual strength and its capacity to purposeful mission.

Dismantling structural racism by advocating and acting to break down the systems, practices and thinking that underlie bias, prejudice and oppression of people of color.

Eradicating systemic poverty by working to change laws, policies, plans and structures in our society that perpetuate economic exploitation of people who are poor.

The recent listening gatherings with Trinity congregants showed support for our church's commitment to social justice. To the Session, Matthew 25 looked like a framework to incorporate some projects that our church already is invested in, as well as to develop or take part in other initiatives that also might tie us more closely to other churches with a similar commitment.

Session Information

June Session Meeting Highlights

- The Session sent a note of appreciation to Alan Cameron for building the table in the narthex to the right of the entrance to the sanctuary. Alan built the table from wood from the red oak tree that was removed from the front of the church.
- Total income for May was \$12,650 above budget while YTD income was \$80,464 above budget. Expenses for May were \$12,751 below budget and YTD expenses were \$62,070 below budget. Net income for May YTD was negative \$100. YTD net income was \$18,393.
- The Capital Campaign Committee reported on the progress of projects currently under contract. Additional potential projects using remaining funds were discussed and prioritized by the Committee. After estimates are obtained, the Committee will meet again to finalize the nature of the projects and propose a recommendation to Session for final approval.
- Session voted to become a PCUSA Matthew 25 congregation. As such, Trinity makes a commitment to building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism and eradicating systemic poverty.

Good Samaritan Fund

As you may know, Trinity has a Good Samaritan Fund which is used to help people in need at the pastor's discretion. Usually we budget a minimal amount of \$200, and most years it is enough. This year however, the budgeted amount is long gone since there have been a lot of needs in the community--including a case last week where someone showed up on Sunday needing groceries and a place to stay (the shelters were all full). This will help sponsor and provide a bit of hope to meet the needs of our struggling neighbors. Thank you!
